The third edition of *EULab Summer School on Labour Migration in the EU* will take place from 26 June (Monday) to 6 July (Thursday) 2023 in Naples.

Lectures and workshops cover four main modules:

- The European Pillar of Social Rights;
- Migrant Workers’ Socio-Economic Rights;
- *Focus*: Agriculture;
- *Focus*: Domestic work.

Teaching activities will be held by the *Key-Staff Members* of *EULab* and by invited *Guest Lecturers* from Italy and other Countries.

Workshops include activities where participants to *EULab* may work on practical cases and/or meet practitioners, policy makers and stakeholders, with the aim of contributing to current debate on inclusion of Third-Countries Nationals (TCNs) in the European Union.
